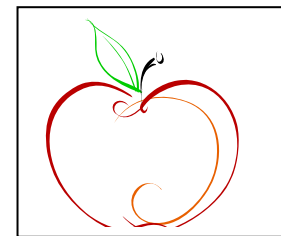
Apple Crisp Recipe

As you may know, the students made Apple Crisp this month. Many of our parents ask us for the recipe so we print it in the newsletter every year. Ms De suggests that it tastes much better served warm with a big scoop of vanilla ice cream.

Apple Crisp
4-6 apples (peeled and sliced)

Topping
1 cup oats
½ tsp salt
1/3 cup flour
½ cup brown sugar
½ cup melted butter
1 tsp cinnamon

Place apples in baking dish or pie plate. Mix the topping ingredients together and sprinkle on top of the apples. Bake at 375 degrees for 30 minutes and enjoy!





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Fees

Operation Christmas Child

Time flies and believe it or not, Christmas is around the corner! It reminds us of Jesus' unconditional love, His amazing spirit of sacrifice and humility. In response to His love, Operation Christmas Child (OCC) offers you an opportunity to help your children put into practice one of the verses we learned earlier this year, "when you did for one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me" (Matthews 25:40). It can be a fun family activity through which you can teach your children how to share Jesus' love with the disadvantaged children in developing countries. Get a shoebox, stuff it with new toys, stationery or basic necessities like a toothbrush, and make a donation of \$7 for shipping. That's all you need to do. You will find all the details you need to know in the pamphlets displayed in the Preschool. We have a limited supply of shoeboxes, so we encourage you to use your own, but by all means take one from us if needed.

We will collect all the shoeboxes by November 10. Try to get your children involved in selecting the gifts while you shop and explain to them why you are doing this or even get them to draw a personal card and tuck it into the shoebox. Jesus said, "If you are faithful in little things, you will be faithful in large ones." (Luke 16:10)

This of course is not mandatory. We understand and respect that you have your own reasons for not participating.

Reminders:

- **If you have any empty ice cream buckets, the Preschool has many uses for them.**
